



GQ Code of Conduct was written and implemented to articulate accepted culture for behavior within the GQ community.

The Code of Conduct is not meant to be restrictive or definitive by its written context, more to set out a code of expectation to ensure inclusiveness, safe and fair enjoyment of the sport within the International Federation of American Football Rules and Interpretations, and any local adaptions as published.

Presentation for Club Delegates, QGOA, Coaches, Administrators, Players and general community



The GQ Code of Conduct core statement:

Every person, whether spectator, player, club member, official, participant, administrator, coach, parent or member of the community involved with the sport, should work to ensure:

- inclusion of every person regardless of their age, gender or sexual orientation
- inclusion of every person regardless of their race, culture or religion
- opportunities for people of all abilities to participate in the sport and develop to their full potential
- respect is shown towards others, the club and the broader community
- a safe and inclusive environment for all
- elimination of violent and abusive behaviour
- protection from sexual harassment, racial vilification or intimidation.
- adherence to the rules of the sport and the rules & directives of Gridiron Queensland Inc.
- that their actions and words, whether written or spoken, present the sport, its members & affiliates in the best manner possible.



The GQ Code of Conduct – Players:

- Play by the rules
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach
 the official during a break or after the competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately
 distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any
 sport.
- Work equally hard for yourself and/or your team. Your team's performance will benefit & so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.
- Treat all participants in your sport as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your coach, team-mates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Their actions and words, whether written or spoken, should present the sport, its members & affiliates in the best manner possible.



The GQ Code of Conduct - Parents:

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children always to play according to the rule and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities
- Respect officials' decision and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
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The GQ Code of Conduct - Coaches:

- Remember that people participate for pleasure and winning is only part of the fun.
- Never ridicule or yell at a player for making a mistake or not coming first.
- Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport and teach your players to do the same.
- Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience. All people are deserving
 of equal attention and opportunities.
- Colts avoid overplaying the talented players; the just-average need and deserve equal time.
- Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all players.
- Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes
 opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators. Encourage
 players to do the same.
- Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training and competition.



The GQ Code of Conduct – Coaches continued:

- Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of young people.
- Any physical contact with a young person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Their actions and words, whether written or spoken, should present the sport, its members & affiliates in the best manner possible.



The GQ Code of Conduct – Officials:

- Compliment and encourage all participants.
- Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.
- Condemn unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all opponents.
- Emphasise the spirit of the game rather than the errors.
- Encourage and promote rule changes that will make participation more enjoyable.
- Be a good sport yourself. Actions speak louder than words.
- Keep up to date with the latest trends in officiating and the principles of growth and development of young people.
- Remember, you set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be positive and supportive.
- Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.
- Their actions and words, whether written or spoken, should present the sport, its members & affiliates in the best manner possible.



The GQ Code of Conduct – Administrators:

- Involve young people in planning, leadership, evaluation and decision making related to the activity.
- Give all people equal opportunities to participate.
- Create pathways for people to participate in sport not just as a player but as a coach, referee, administrator etc.
- Ensure that rules, equipment, length of games and training schedules are modified to suit the age, ability and maturity level of young players.
- Provide quality supervision and instruction for junior players.
- Remember that young people participate for their enjoyment and benefit. Do not overemphasise awards.
- Help coaches and officials highlight appropriate behaviour and skill development, and help improve the standards of coaching and officiating.
- Ensure that everyone involved in sport emphasises fair play and not winning at all costs.



The GQ Code of Conduct – Administrators continued:

- Give a code of behaviour sheet to spectators, officials, parents, coaches, players and the media, and encourage them to follow it.
- Remember, you set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be positive and supportive.
- Support implementation of the National Junior Sport Policy.
- Make it clear that abusing people in any way is unacceptable and will result in disciplinary action.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Always act in the best interest of the sport.
- Their actions and words, whether written or spoken, should present the sport, its members & affiliates in the best manner possible.
